We are excited to welcome you to campus on Move-in days, August 17th, 18th, and 19th. Before move-in, we wanted to provide you with additional information.

- **General Information about our program and Residential Dining:** We have provided a series of videos for you that discuss many of the most common questions we get from parents about how things work in Housing at CSULB. There is also an introduction to Residential Dining Services. All are available at the [Parent and Guardian Resources page](#).

**COVID Protocols:**

- **Before Move-In:** To help reduce Covid infections **we are requiring students to take a PCR test no more than 48 hours before their scheduled move in time**. If they are positive, we ask that they stay home until they are cleared with no symptoms and a negative test result. Students should have evidence of negative test result to show at check in.
- **Campus Immunization Requirement:** All students are required to be fully vaccinated. For most people this includes two vaccinations and one booster. There are very few exemptions for medical reasons.
- **During Move-In:** We ask that all students are accompanied by no more than three other individuals to assist them with move in. Please make sure all involved are symptom free. When inside buildings, **all will be asked to wear masks**.
- **After Move-In:** Students will be required to wear masks in all public areas (student lounges, corridors, etc,) of the residence halls. Students who test positive for COVID-19 or the seasonal flu should not attend class or work. **We encourage students to consider going to their permanent homes to recover**. If they are unable, they will be asked to isolate in their rooms, wear a face covering as much as possible, and minimize contact with others. Those in isolation should avoid shared areas of the residence halls other than their residence hall room, shared restrooms, and getting to-go meals at the dining hall. Students will be cleared to return to normal activities by Student Health Services. We understand you may have questions about sharing a room with someone who tested positive for COVID-19. Due to high vaccination and booster rates within the CSULB community along with higher population-level immunity and mutations in the virus that are associated with milder illness, CSULB is well-positioned to use the isolate-in-place protocol.
